The WW1 Memorial in St Ann's Church, St Ann's Well Road disappeared during the demolition (April 1971). St Ann's church had been consecrated in 1864.

2012

We resolved to identify the names on this memorial. Over the next 6 years we found records of servicemen from the St Ann's area who had been honoured on other memorials and many enlisted men who had served and returned from the war.

2014

The Nottingham St Ann's Church Men's Institute memorial plaque, originally erected in the now disused Canon Lewis Memorial Hall on Ransom Road, was located. It came into the care and possession of Tony Miller who strove to see it moved to a suitable public location.

2018

Research has not yet determined the fate of the lost St Ann's church memorial, but a photograph was located and given to our group in May 2018. The research document was made available to the Local Studies Library Development Officer of Nottingham Central Library. And full permission was granted to re-print as needed. A subsequent supplement was provided later that year. 974 fallen and 454 survivors were identified. The St Ann's Well Rd Pre-Demolition (1970) website records and honours all of these men.

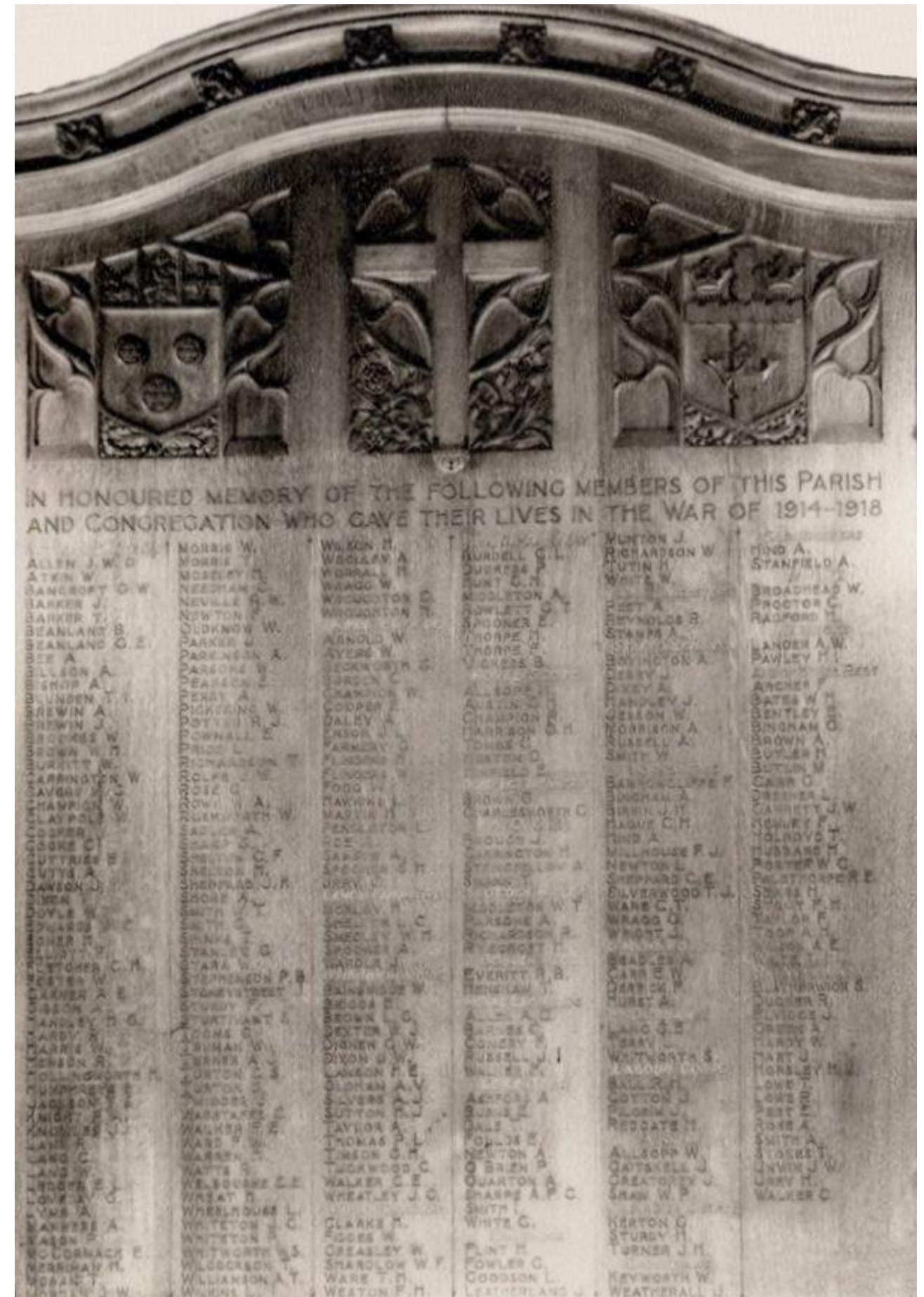
