As a result of the 'demolition' of 1970 the names of the fallen from the St Ann's Well Road (St Ann's parish) area were lost. Consequently we resolved to identify as many of the fallen as possible in order to right this wrong and honour them. The search revealed others honoured elsewhere, those incorrectly recorded and also many who enlisted, served and returned. Our project honours all these men.
